NOTES

- 1. Site approval for temporary traffic signals is required under the Traffic Regulations and General Directions 2002, General Direction 53.
- 2. Upon receipt of the completed application form, the Highway Authority will, if site approval is required, issue the approval based on the submitted O.S. Plan 1:1250 (or better) scale indicating the work area and traffic control arrangements provided by the applicant. The Highway Authority may request changes to the submitted plan and/or traffic control arrangements as necessary.
- 3. It is imperative that at least the minimum advance notice (notice periods given above) is given, where a design for Temporary/Portable Traffic Signals at junctions is requested, i.e. Where there is a junction between a set of shuttle working signals or if more than 2 approaches have a traffic signal control.
- 4. If site approval is not required then the Authority shall take the application as notification of the intention to use 2-way Temporary/Portable Traffic Signals.
- 5. The Authority must be notified if:
 - Any change is made to the date or time of the application.
 - The work is within 100 metres of any permanent signals including Pelican crossings.
 - The work is in the vicinity of a level crossing (Railway Authority must also be consulted).
