Case Study: Meet Foster carer: Ellie and her daughter Imogen



Throughout October we're celebrating 'Children of foster carers' month 2023!

Birth children of foster carers make a massive difference to those in care. They can really help the child/young person settle into family life, helping them feel welcome and loved. We spoke to one of our foster carers Ellie and her birth child Imogen about fostering alongside your own children.

We asked Ellie the following questions:

Who is in your family unit?

My husband, two birth children who are 8 and 10 years old and myself. We currently foster a baby who is 14 months old. I do not work as I am at home with the baby and you're not allowed to work if you foster babies as obviously the baby needs you.

How long have you been fostering?

We've been fostering for 5 years.

What made you want to add to your family?

I enjoy being a mum, but I'm a terrible housewife! 😉. It's nice having the flexibility and being there for all the children whilst also doing something fulfilling.

How did you prepare your family for having a new addition?

We were very honest. We explained it to our children using age-appropriate language. We talk to them constantly. We remind them that they and the child are important to us. We also involved the children in the whole process. They love having a foster brother to play with.

How have your birth children helped settle in your foster baby?

They've both been amazing, they treat them like their own brother.

What would you say to people who have children about fostering a child/children?

It's a personal decision that only they can consider, but if you're thinking about it, it's probably likely it'll be right for you.

It's a really positive experience for the whole family. We all get excited by the baby's milestones and that's lovely to share.

What support do you get?

I like the Council's activities that the children can get involved in. I really like my Social Worker, they do all they can.

We asked Imogen, the birth child of Ellie:

What's it like having another brother in the family?

It's strange at first, but it's quite fun. He can be a menace sometimes! It's lovely to give to another.

Do you get asked questions about the new baby in the family?

I'll answer questions if people ask, but I always think about his safety.

Are you sad when a foster brother/sister leave the family?

Yes, but it's not all bad, most of the time we see them again.

What do you love about having a baby brother become part of your family?

I love to play with him. He makes us laugh because he likes watching the washing machine. He also loves posting things!

An example of a payment if you fostered with us

There are several types of fostering that you can get involved with. One of the ways you could get involved is with Supported Lodgings. This would involve providing a room and helping a young person aged 16+ to gain independence.

Tim's story



Tim (56) works full-time but most days he gets home to cook up a meal for Mark and himself to share. They chat over the meal about their day together.

Tim says "It's simple really. If you like young people, understand some of the issues they may face and can just offer a helping hand then

this role is perfect for you. It's great to see them grow in confidence and go off into the world.

Tim receives £286.50 per week and does this alongside his full-time job.
