Welcome to another issue of our 'Thinking About Fostering' newsletter! This time, we will be focusing on another type of fostering: Supported Lodging Hosts (SLH).

Many people think of fostering as an intensive, full-time role. However, many of our Supported Lodgings Hosts work full time or part time alongside this role. Most of our young people are in education or employment and simply need guidance and support as they grow into adulthood.

You will be fully supported by our team throughout the application stage and beyond, and will receive a weekly payment of £286.50 per week, per young person living with you.

Meet Kathy (Supported Lodgings Host)

Kathy Campbell lives with her husband Arthur in North West Leicestershire. Her two grown up sons have flown the nest.

Who lives in your house?

I live with my husband Arthur and have two young people, a male and a female, one aged 20 who works and the other who is 16 and a full-time student.

How long have you been a Supported Lodgings Host? Since 2010.



How did you become a Supported Lodgings Host?

Through my son's friend. He was being cared for by a Supported Lodgings Host. I had a coffee with her and then she put me in contact with the Placements Manager.

What does a Supported Lodgings Host do?

I help young people living with me to become independent. We work through a plan together to learn about money management, budgeting, bills, looking after your health and wellbeing as well as cooking. I involve them in my normal everyday family life, so we play games and have family get togethers such as BBQ's and dinners.

Have you had any challenges?

I've had a few challenging times, but my supervising social worker has been very supportive and gave me guidance.

What would you say to people thinking about becoming a Supported Lodgings Host? I'd encourage people to open their homes. Supported lodgings isn't the same as mainstream foster care, this is more of a supportive role for young people to lead their own lives.

It's so rewarding, it's lovely to see young people become confident and blossom. They say things to me like "you've changed my life, my confidence has gone from very little to amazing. I would not be the person today without your guidance."

We're proud to offer our foster carers generous remuneration packages in recognition of their skillset, experience, time, and dedication.





Our Supported Lodgings Hosts currently receive £286.50 per week, per young person in their home, and they can **remain working full time** if they wish.

Our Supported Lodgings Plus Hosts currently receive £562.50 per week, per young person in their home. This role is designed to offer more dedicated time and attention to the young person, so is ideal for those **not working**, or **working part time** (maximum 16 hours per week).
